## Important people

Emperor Claudius – The first Roman Emperor to successfully Invade Britain. Claudius laughed a military Campaign of 40,000 Roman soldiers and several war elephants, which would lead a conquest of England in 43AD.

Julius Caesar – A famous Roman leader who attempted to invade Britain. He won many battles for Rome and helped to grow the empire. He was assassinated by a large group of Roman senators in 44BC
