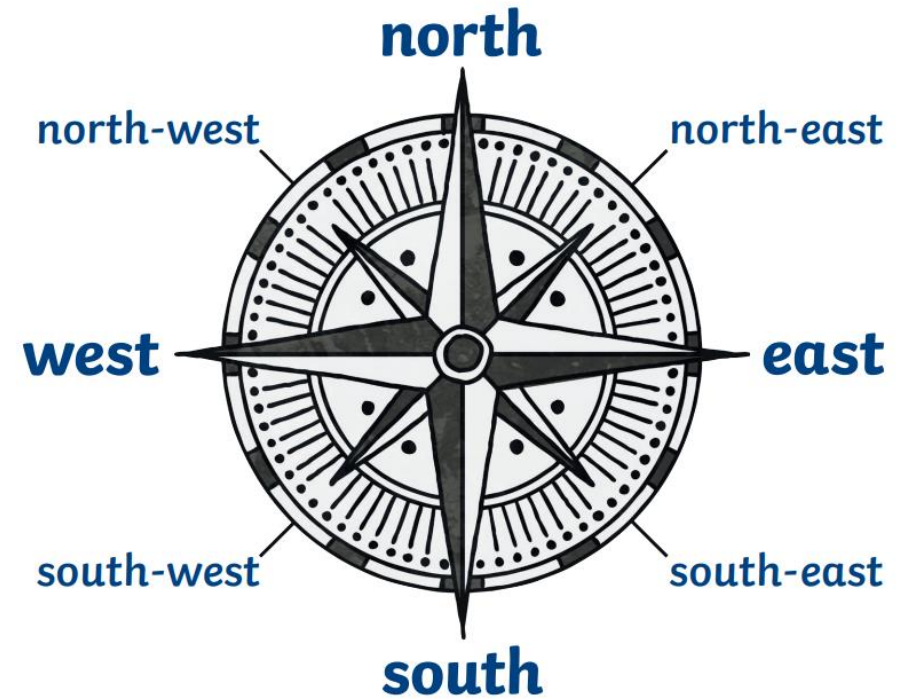


Vocabulary

Longitude	Imaginary lines which run north to south across the globe from pole to pole.
Latitude	Imaginary parallel lines which circle the globe from east to west.
Equator	The Earth's Equator is the imaginary line that runs around the centre of the globe at 0 degrees latitude, at equal distance between the North and South Poles.
Compass	A compass is used to work out direction. A four-point compass can give a rough direction whereas a sixteen-point compass is much more precise.
Continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).

We can use 8 compass points to be even more precise when describing where something is. Rather than just using the 4 points of North, East, South and West.

- languages/signs
- religion, government, art and music
