PE Federation Trip

On Wednesday, we had a fantastic federation trip to Woodside Primary. The children got to try out all sorts of PE games including golf, cricket, curling, dodgeball and archery. It was so lovely to see them working and playing together. Even lovelier was watching them remember each other from previous events and continue to build those friendships!

Maths

In maths, we've been looking at finding unit and non-unit fractions of amounts and objects. The children have worked really well using different methods and are getting more confident every day.

Literacy

We've started our new text — *The BFG*! The children are really enjoying the story so far. We've been using Roald Dahl's amazing language to help us write character descriptions and come up with our own similes. Some brilliant ideas have been shared already!

Science

In science, we've been exploring magnetic fields and testing how they work with different objects. Lots of great investigating going on, and the children have really enjoyed experimenting and making predictions.

DT

We've started our new topic in DT all about automata toys. The children are learning what they are and how they move — we're looking forward to getting creative and designing our own soon!

French

In French, we've been learning numbers up to 30. The children have picked it up really quickly and have enjoyed practising together in class games and activities.

Nurture Room

In Moles Nurture Room, we've been reading plenty of lovely stories together. We've also been working hard on our phonics, focusing on the *ai* and *ee* sounds. In maths, we've been practising our number bonds to 20 — the children have done a great job remembering and using them in different ways.

In Otters this week...

A Great Start to Our Final Term!

It's been a lovely first week back, and it's hard to believe we're already into our final term of the year—and the first week has flown by!

In writing, we've started our new class text, *The BFG* by Roald Dahl. The children have enjoyed reading the first three chapters and getting stuck into Dahl's wonderful language. They've been busy using noun phrases, expanded noun phrases, prepositional phrases and fronted adverbials to describe characters and settings. So far, they've created some brilliant Wanted posters, character descriptions and setting descriptions—lots of imagination on show already!

In maths, Year 5 have kicked off their new topic on angles. They've been learning what an angle actually is, how to describe turns, and how to use a protractor to measure accurately. Year 6 have been revisiting some key learning from earlier in the year—looking at calculating fractions, converting between fractions, decimals and percentages, and finding percentages of amounts.

We've also begun our new guided reading text: *Malala: My Story of Standing Up for Girls' Rights* by Malala Yousafzai. The children are really enjoying it so far and are fascinated by her story—they're keen to learn more about her life and the different culture she grew up in.

In geography, the children learnt about the features of mountain ranges and created some beautifully detailed, labelled drawings. During our SCARF lesson this week, we talked about different emotions and how various situations can make us feel in different ways. We also joined in with the NSPCC's *Speak Out, Stay Safe* online assembly, where the children learnt about the importance of speaking up and the tools they have to help keep themselves safe.

In PE with Mr Knight, the children had an orienteering session out on the school field. They practised reading simple maps and following instructions—it was lovely to see them working together and enjoying being outdoors.

And finally—some very exciting news! On Wednesday, we handed out parts for our summer production. The children will be bringing home their completed scripts on Monday—watch this space!

Just a quick note: there'll be no homework set this week while we settle into our new topics. Homework will be back as usual from next Thursday.


