#### This week in Moles class...

In Literacy, the children have been writing their reports and learning about dialogue, practising how to use it effectively in their writing.

In Maths, Year 4 have continued their multiplication journey by learning how to multiply by 100 and using the formal written method. Year 3 have also been using the formal method, focusing on regrouping ones and tens.

During Guided Reading, we explored a beautiful new poem called *Grey Seal* by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris. This poetic tale of a Scottish selkie helped us learn about different poetic techniques.

We also marked VE Day by dressing in red, white, and blue. Our class assembly focused on remembrance, the importance of peace, and the events of the past. We listened to the voices of evacuees and Vera Lynn's hopeful songs to the soldiers.

In Science, we've been building on our knowledge of push and pull forces by investigating *friction* through hands-on experiments.

In Art, the children created layered backgrounds and combined contour line drawings with different materials to explore artistic effects.

In RE, we studied the story of *Pentecost*, identifying symbols in the story and linking them to the Holy Spirit.

#### What a Fantastic Start to the Summer Term!

It's been another brilliant week in Otters! The children returned refreshed from their long weekend and jumped straight back into their learning with great enthusiasm.

In maths, our Year 5s have been tackling the challenge of adding fractions and mixed numbers. I've been so impressed with how well they've remembered their previous learning—great work! Meanwhile, Year 6 have completed their final maths unit on statistics. They've been interpreting and creating pie charts and line graphs, and have learnt how to calculate the 'mean'—a tricky concept that they've handled brilliantly.

In writing, the children have finished their newspaper reports using a model text to guide and inspire them. We've also started exploring our new class book, *The Iron Man* by Ted Hughes, and it's safe to say it's already a hit!

Our PSHCE lesson this week sparked some lovely conversations about personal attributes and the kinds of jobs these might suit. The children shared their future aspirations, ranging from vets and dentists to interior designers, shopkeepers, restaurant owners, and babysitters—what a wonderfully varied list!

Last week in geography, we explored different types of mountains and how they are formed. The children produced some fantastic diagrams and explanations to show their understanding. In computing, we've begun our work on online safety. The children engaged thoughtfully in discussions about current issues and showed great maturity in their responses.

PE this week saw us starting our rounders unit. We focused on throwing, fielding, and batting skills—and I must say, I was very impressed with everyone's effort and teamwork.

Next week will look a little different as it's Year 6 SATs week. We want to wish all our Year 6s the very best of luck—they've worked incredibly hard and we're already proud of each and every one of them, no matter what!


