### **School Council Trip to The Houses of Parliament**

On Tuesday, our school council (plus a few extras), went to visit the Houses of Parliament in London. We had a fascinating tour around both the House of Lords and House of Commons and even watched a live debate on Net Zero with Ed Milliband.

Our local MP, Matt Bishop met us in the education centre for a Q and A session and the children asked lots of interesting questions. We even stood above the place where Guy Fawkes was discovered with 36 barrels of gunpowder in what has come to be known as the Gunpowder Plot.

We learnt many interesting facts about the Houses of Parliament; they are colour coded - red for the Lords, green for the Commons and gold for the monarch, the King is not permitted to go into the House of Commons, it used to be a Royal Palace, it was destroyed multiple times by fire.

All children were impeccably behaved and represented Soudley School brilliantly!

#### This week in Hedgehogs....

We have had a fun week with our story Look Up! Yesterday we wrote our very owns stories based on the story structure of the book. Year 1s did their phonic screening check and did amazingly well.

In Science we have been doing some field study like real biologists. We sampled areas of the school field counting how many daisies were in a cut out of our footprint. We found more daisies in the middle of the field than the edges and we thought that was because there was more sun there.

In Maths KS1 have been continuing their time unit and reception have been getting very good at recognising numbers on ten frames without counting.

In RE we have been learning more about Islam. We learnt that God has 99 names. The children chose their favourite one eg The Strong One, The Most Loving and The Avenger and then had a try at writing the name in Arabic!

#### This week in Moles class...

In Maths, Year 3 have been exploring the topic of money. The children have been using coins to make different amounts and have enjoyed solving real-life money problems. Year 4, meanwhile, have started their new topic on decimals. They have been learning how to recognise and write tenths and hundredths, both as fractions and in decimal form, developing a strong understanding of place value.

In Literacy, we've been reading *The BFG* by Roald Dahl. The children have been inspired by Dahl's imaginative language and have worked on replacing the word "said" with more expressive alternatives. We've also explored alliteration to make our writing more creative and engaging.

During Guided Reading, we have been focusing on our VIPERS skills while reading *Women in the Skies*, which tells the inspiring story of Amy Johnson. The children have practised skills such as inference, prediction, and vocabulary understanding while learning about this remarkable historical figure.

In Science, we've been investigating magnets. The children have tested the strength of different magnets through practical experiments and enjoyed making predictions and recording their observations.

Our RE lessons have included a special visit from Mrs Saed, who spoke to us about Ramadan and shared insights into what matters most to Muslims living in modern-day Britain. It was a meaningful and enriching experience for the whole class.

In French, we've been learning the vocabulary for family members. The children have been practising how to introduce their family in French and using their new words in fun speaking activities.

#### In Otters this week...

In writing this week, we've continued to hurtle through *The BFG*! The children have been learning the spelling rules for the '-shun' suffix — looking at when to use *-tion*, *-cian*, *-ssion*, and *-sion* with root words. They then used these 'shun' words to write some wonderfully comical dreams. We also explored the character of Sophie in more depth and created a 'role on the wall' to consider her emotions and personality traits.

In maths, Year 5 have continued their work on angles. They've been calculating missing angles around a point and on a straight line, using their knowledge of degrees in a full turn and a half turn to help them.

In guided reading, we continued learning about Malala Yousafzai. The children have shown real interest in how women are treated in different cultures and the extreme actions some people take in the name of religion. We had some thoughtful and mature discussions around terrorism, and the children impressed us with their sensitivity and insight.

In geography, we looked at the climates of various mountain regions. The children compared these with our own climate and made informed decisions about whether they'd like to live in the mountains or somewhere else — most opted for somewhere else!

In our SCARF lesson, we discussed trust — who we trust, why we trust them, and what we might do if that trust was ever broken. We also continued talking about feelings, especially how our bodies often give us clues before we even realise how we're feeling. I was really impressed by how many of the children were able to recognise the physical effects of strong emotions and the strategies they use to manage them.

Homework has been sent home and is due back by next Wednesday. Alongside this, children should be practising their lines for the summer production — it's coming together nicely!
