

### This week in Moles class...

It's been a busy and exciting time in Year 3/4! In maths, we've been tackling the challenge of dividing 2- and 3-digit numbers using scaling reasoning, problem-solving strategies, and our understanding of place value. The children have shown great perseverance and thinking skills.

In literacy, we've been writing letters to Hogarth, offering him advice about what he should do about the Iron Man. The ideas the children have come up with have been thoughtful, creative, and full of imagination!

During guided reading, we explored the acrostic poem *Swallow*, looking closely at its meaning and the poetic techniques the author used to bring the words to life.

Over in science, KS2 students have been designing their own experiments using their knowledge of forces. It's been fantastic to see their curiosity and scientific thinking in action.

In art, the children have been creating mixed media portraits, experimenting with composition and exploring different artistic styles and choices.

And finally, in RE, we've been wrapping up our topic on Pentecost, learning about how it is celebrated as the Church's birthday—a meaningful and joyful end to our learning.

#### In Otters this week...

It's been another action-packed week for our Year 5 and 6 children!

In **maths**, Year 5 have wrapped up their work on fractions – they've been subtracting fractions from mixed numbers and multiplying both unit and non-unit fractions by whole numbers. Year 6 have been refreshing their understanding of place value, multiplication and division, and how to simplify and compare fractions – all part of our mission to get them *Year 7 ready!* 

In **writing**, the children have written thoughtful letters of advice to a character from *The Iron Man*. They focused on the layout of a formal letter and explored the differences between formal and informal language. The quality of their writing has been very impressive!

Our **SCARF lesson** this week focused on the idea of *community*. We talked about what community means to us, discussed our Soudley School community, and shared what we like (and maybe don't like as much!) about it. The children spoke with real maturity and showed great respect for each other's ideas.

In **geography**, the children completed their research projects on mountains from different continents – we can't wait to showcase their fantastic work on our classroom displays!

**PE** on Wednesday had us working on our fielding skills – before the heavens opened! The children practised using the 'long barrier' technique to stop the ball from rolling away, with some great teamwork on display.

We've also continued rehearsing songs for our upcoming **summer production**, and the children are absolutely loving them – there's a real buzz building!

A huge well done to three of our girls who took part in the **Forest of Dean gymnastics competition** on Tuesday – they represented the school brilliantly and performed amazingly.

We also had a visit from **Puddleducks** on Tuesday afternoon, who talked to the children about the importance of water safety – a very timely and valuable session.

Well done, everyone, for another fantastic week!

I would also like to thank you all for your kind words following the news that I will be leaving Soudley at the end of the Summer Term - I truly do appreciate them and will miss you all too!




# Orchard project
