This week in Moles!

In English, we have been diving into the world of *The BFG* by Roald Dahl. Using our senses, we imagined what it would be like to enter Giant Country. We created some fantastic similes to describe both the giants and the mysterious setting they live in. Building on that, we stepped into Sophie's shoes and wrote about how it might feel to travel to Giant Country with the BFG. The children really embraced the imaginative writing and produced some wonderfully descriptive work.

In Maths, Year 3 have just finished their unit on time and have now moved on to learning about length and capacity. They've been busy measuring, comparing and solving practical problems with enthusiasm. Year 4 have been working on comparing decimals, learning how to read and understand decimal numbers in different contexts. They've shown great progress and confidence in this area.

In PSHE, we have started our topic on first aid. The children have been learning what to do in different situations, including how to stay calm and how to help someone safely.

In Computing, we've been exploring the use of timers in our code. We had lots of fun creating a magic trick where a bunny disappears and reappears with a magician. The children enjoyed seeing how changing the timing in their code could affect what happens on screen, and they showed great problem-solving skills throughout.

In our Nurture Room, we have been exploring the theme of *The Lost Species*, taking a closer look at dinosaurs. The children have loved learning about different types of dinosaurs, how they lived, and what might have happened to them. This topic has sparked a lot of curiosity and some brilliant questions!


We're incredibly proud of each and every one of them.
























Appointments during school hours
